Immediately south of Jacksonville along the western banks of the St. Johns River, Clay County has all the amenities of a major metro area. Clay County is home to a variety of industries, technical businesses, and numerous business parks. North Florida's newest interstate, the First Coast Expressway (FCX), is currently under construction and will connect I-10 in Duval to I-95 in St. Johns. New business development is already under construction along the path of the FCX.

Niagara Bottling is a family owned and operated beverage manufacturer that began in Irvine, CA in 1963. Using heavy automation in their manufacturing processes and high-quality innovation has proved integral to their success. The 820,000 SF manufacturing facility is located on 147 acres in Middleburg, directly off the First Coast Expressway and the new Atlantis Drive. The project included \$13M of utility infrastructure upgrades to the site benefiting subsequent projects. The initial project proposes 100+ high wage jobs and \$100M in capital investment. A planned expansion will increase these numbers further.

Clay County's proximity to key land, air, rail, and marine transportation routes serving the Southeastern United States and beyond (including the Port of Jacksonville), combined with the cost advantage of being on a "back-haul" shipping route, allows local manufacturers to receive raw materials and ship final products on a reliable schedule at competitive costs.

Clay County offers the kind of highly-skilled, motivated, and trainable workers that are needed by today's sophisticated manufacturing operations. They are available at a price that is lower than in many other metropolitan areas in the Southeastern United States. Much of the area's workforce has military ties and experience, giving them specialized and highly technical expertise. SJRSC offers extensive training programs for students seeking gainful employment within the industry.

COUNTY INCENTIVES

Economic Development (Tax Increment Grant)

Targets commercial projects that add to the tax base, project new employment in excess of 10 direct, full-time equivalent employees and makes at least a \$1M capital investment.

Tangible Personal Property

An incentive designed for relocating companies that invest at least \$1M in manufacturing equipment at the Clay County business location.

Regulatory Relief

The Clay County government focuses on remaining very pro-business and supportive through fast-track permitting and approvals for job creating economic development projects.

Large Employer Retention Grant

An incentive designed to retain large employers (over 100 employees) in Clay County.
